



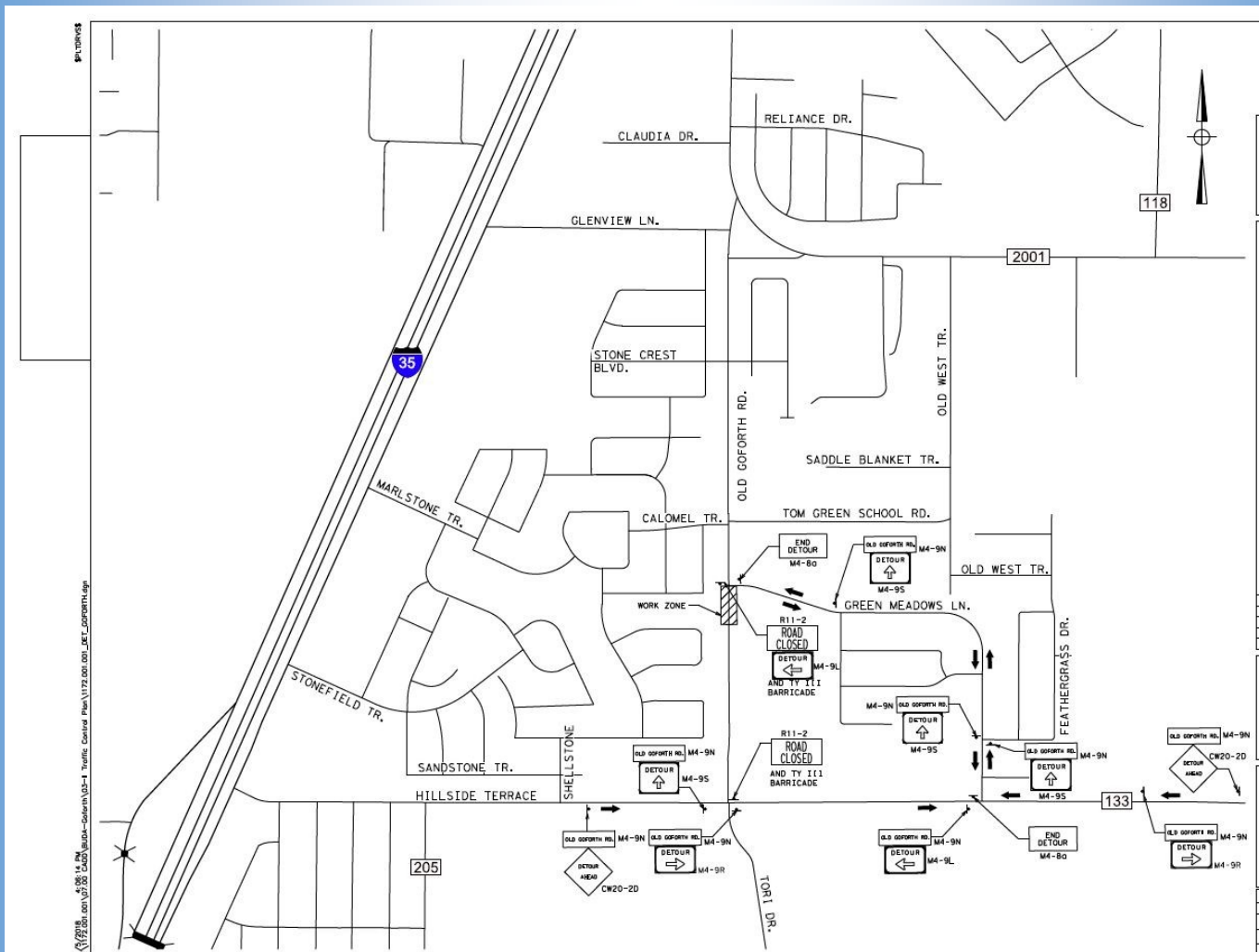

TRAFFIC ALERT

OLD GOFORTH ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Due to road construction, Old Goforth Road between Green Meadows Lane and Hillside Terrace will be closed on Saturday, January 26 and Sunday, January 27. The closure will last from 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM on both days. If the contractor finishes the work on Saturday, then the road will be open Sunday. But for now, plan for the road to be closed on both Saturday and Sunday. Detour signs will be up. The road improvement project is part of the bond package passed in 2014.

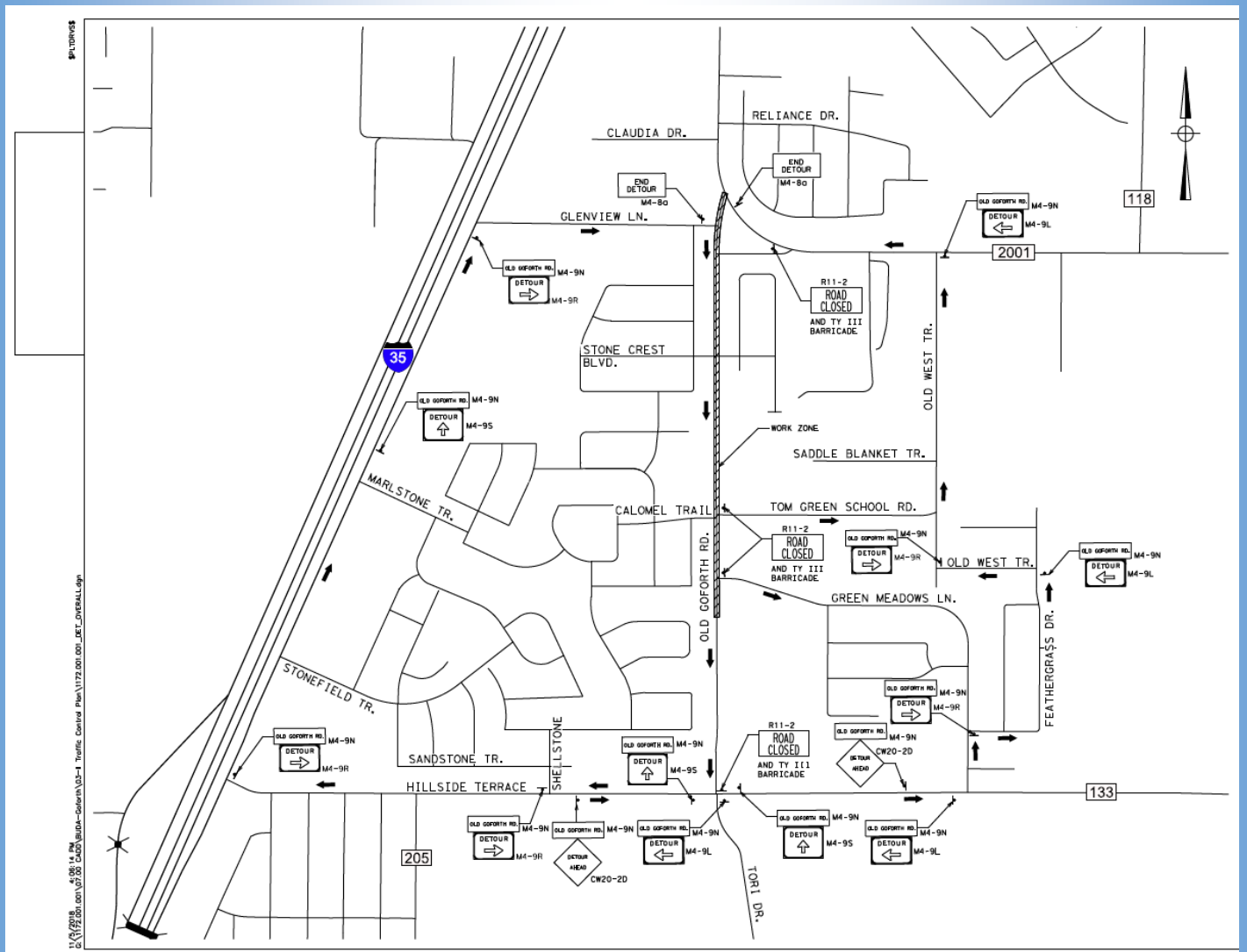

OXBOW TRAILS NEIGHBORHOOD DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

First Phase of Construction Begins on Tuesday, January 22, 2019

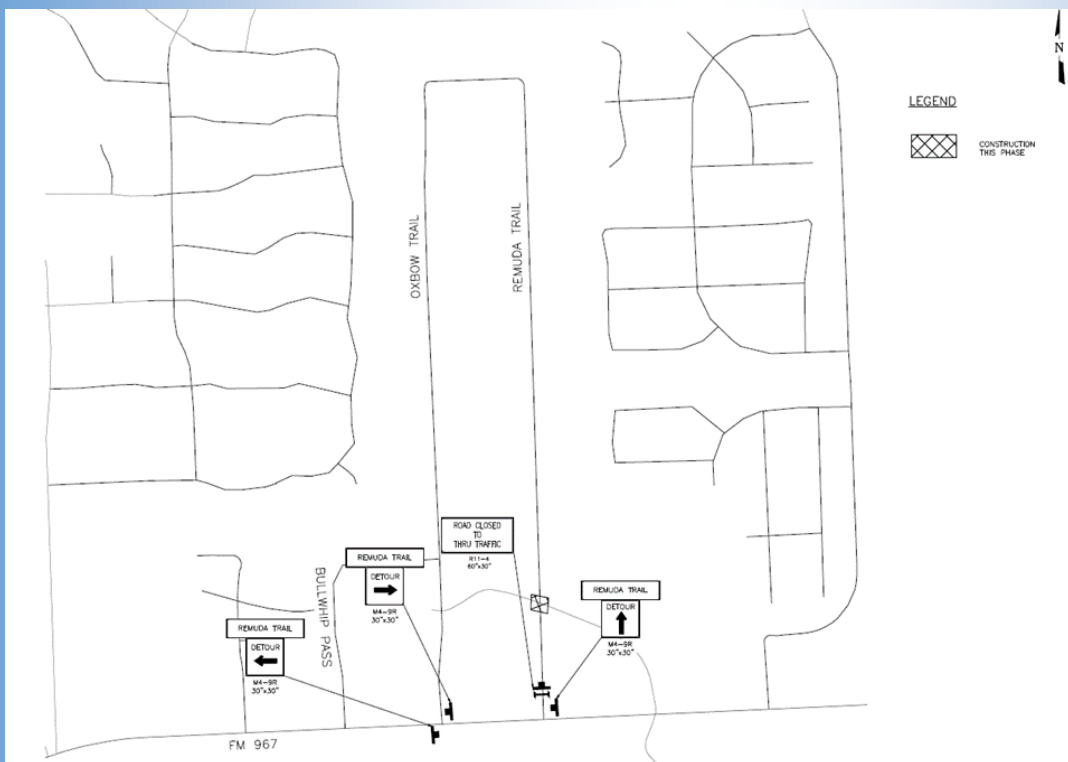
BUDA, TX — On Tuesday, January 22, construction will begin on the Oxbow Trails Neighborhood Drainage Improvements Project. Patin Construction will be performing survey work and installation of erosion and sediment controls within the existing earthen drainage channel located between Oxbow Trail and Remuda Trail. During the week of January 13, 2019, the contractor will be staging traffic control devices in the right-of-way to prepare for planned detours. The first phase of project construction will include removal of an existing drainage culvert within Remuda Trail to be replaced by a new reinforced concrete box culvert.

REMUDA TRAIL STREET CLOSURE

Remuda Trail will be closed to all through traffic just north of RM 967 during the first phase of the construction project. The closure begins on January 22. Detour signs will be up in the area. However, access will be allowed to residential properties along Remuda Trail south of the culvert for the duration of the construction project.

The contractor will be allowed to work between 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., will be required to secure the construction zone overnight, and have a traffic control plan in force at all times during work within the public right-of-way.

The Remuda Trail culvert phase of project is expected to be finished in early March 2019. We will keep you updated throughout each phase of the drainage improvement project. The improvements are being made as part of Bond Proposition 4.

However, access will be allowed to residential properties along Remuda Trail south of the culvert for the duration of the construction project.

What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

HHW is chemical or solid waste resulting from the maintenance of a home, yard, or vehicle.

Common key words on HHW products:

- Harmful to humans, animals, or environment
- Danger, warning, caution, poisonous, corrosive, toxic, or flammable

HHW can contaminate water, soil, and air if not disposed properly. For safety, health, and environmental reasons, it is illegal to dispose of HHW in the garbage, sewers, or down household or storm drains.

Tips for managing HHW in your home:

- Buy only what you need
- Consider using alternative, non-hazardous products (Ecoycle.org/hazwaste/ecofriendly-cleaning)
- Use an online paint calculator for painting projects

- containers larger than 5 gallons
- waste generated by businesses
(Commercial waste disposal info available on City website - Solid Waste/Recycling)

Max of 25 one gallon buckets of paint per visit
Max of 10 five gallon buckets of paint per visit
