



Severe Weather Possible Friday Afternoon & Evening

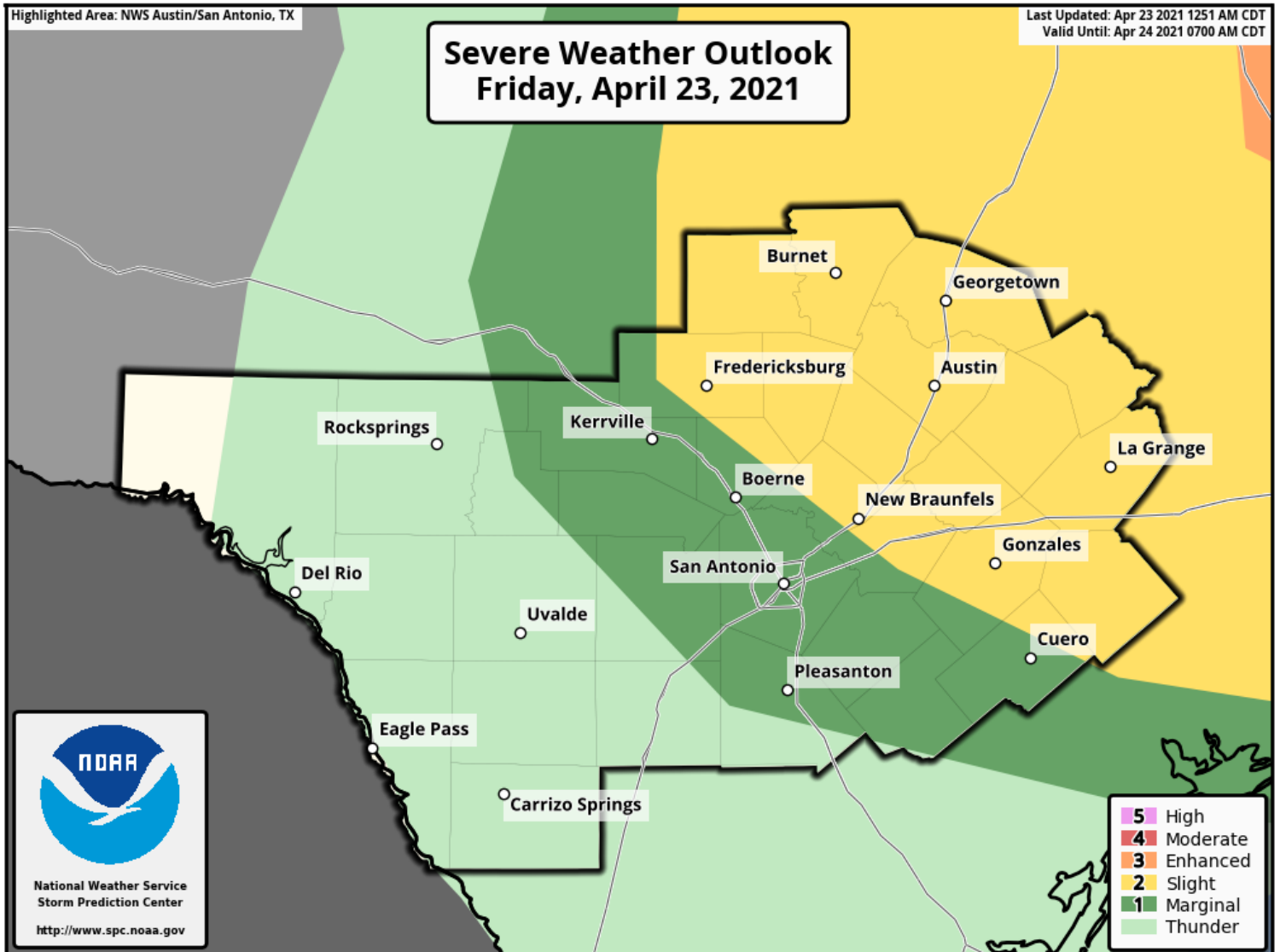
Important Forecast Changes



- The Marginal and Slight Risk areas have been retracted slightly northeastward
- The best chances for severe storms look to remain to our northeast, but a severe storm or two remain possible.
- A very low chance for evening storms exists south/southeast of San Antonio

Key Messages

- ✓ Scattered showers / storms are expected across south central Texas on Friday.
- ✓ Storms will begin to develop 11am-noon and are forecast to push out of the area by about 6pm, with a low chance for later evening storms south/southeast of San Antonio.
- ✓ Storms could become severe this afternoon for locations along and east of a Kerrville to Hondo to Pleasanton line. Hail and high winds are the main severe weather threats.
- ✓ There is a lesser, but non-zero, threat for a tornado in the Slight Risk area.
- ✓ Confidence is low to medium in the severe risk today.





Hazards Summary



**LOCATION
TIMING**

- Hill Country/Along & East of I-35:1pm-7pm
- Low chance for a storm or two from Pleasanton to Hallettsville 8pm-1am



**RAINFALL
FLOODING**

- Rainfall amounts less than 1/10" Rio Grande plains including Del Rio. Amounts 1/3" or less elsewhere with isolated totals up to 1" under a strong/severe storm, mainly north of I-10.
- Flooding is not expected



HAIL

- Severe storms could produce hail in excess of 2 inches in diameter north of a line from Fredericksburg to New Braunfels to Giddings.
- Hail to 1 inch possible in the remainder of the outlook area.



**DAMAGING
WIND**

- Severe storms could produce wind gusts in excess of 60 mph.



TORNADOES

- An isolated tornado can not be ruled out



LIGHTNING

- Frequent cloud to ground lightning strikes possible
- "Bolts from the blue" can strike 10-15 miles away from where it is actually raining
